



SEARCHING THE PROJECT DATABASE

Explore, Brainstorm, Imagine....

You may already have a clear idea for your FFT fellowship—or so many ideas that you don’t know where to begin.

Our Project Database can help spark inspiration. It contains descriptions of more than 10,000 FFT fellowships and is searchable by discipline, destination, and grade level. Here are some tips to make your search more effective:

- For the widest range of fellowships in your subject area or instructional focus, enter a keyword in the “Keyword Search” box and leave all other filters set to “All.”
- Keep keywords simple—try one word at a time, and run several related searches. For example, instead of Physical Education, try health, wellness, fitness, or mindfulness. Similarly, digital returns more results than digital learning.
- Use multiple lenses to broaden results. If you’re interested in real-world learning experiences, try keywords like inquiry, project-based, experiential, interdisciplinary, problem-solving, service, or global.
- Searching for a specific destination? Type the location into the “Keyword Search” box.
- If a project catches your eye, scroll right and click “View Report” to read the Fellow’s final report.
- Many Fellows explore inclusion, differentiation, and ESL/ELL strategies. While filters like Special Education or Language/Cultural Immersion can help, broader keywords such as inclusion, differentiation, or autism often yield richer results.
- Avoid acronyms (ELL, ESL, TESOL, CTE, etc.), as they don’t always return accurate results.
